2026 Spring Flower Competition Guidance Sheet

Class	Class Title	Guidance
1	Five stems of Daffodil/Narcissus	All five stems could be one variety, or a mixture of varieties. Choose the Society vase size which is in proportion to the length of flower stems. The flowers should be clean, fresh and free of any blemishes, if possible.
2	Specimen Daffodil/Narcissus	Any variety of Daffodil/Narcissus is acceptable. The flower should be clean, fresh and free of any blemishes, if possible.
3	Winter Flowering Pansies or Violas - three stems	It is recommended that the Pansies or Violas are presented on a card or board with the flower stems immersed in a container of water. This will prevent the flowers from wilting.
4	A bulb in flower growing in a container (NOT Daffodil/Narcissus)	Suggested bulb could be: hyacinth, amaryllis, iris, tulip as examples.
5	A container of bulbs in flower	The container should be full of flowers with no other planted material. There can be a variety of bulbs in flower.
6	Vase of mixed garden flowers	Your flowers must have been growing in your garden and/or allotment.
7	Miniature Flower Arrangement (max 10 cm wide x 10 cm deep)	The height of your arrangement should be in proportion to its size. Your arrangement must not exceed the 10 x 10 cm measurement. Please check you are within these limits when staging your exhibit, using the measure provided.
8	Camellia flower floating in a glass or glass dish	The flower should be clean, fresh and ideally free of any blemishes, but this is not always possible, so still enter your best-looking flower.
9	Hellebore – three flowers floating in a dish	The flowers should be clean, fresh and ideally free of any blemishes, but this is not always possible, so still enter your three best looking flowers.
10	A flowering or foliage house plant	There is no limit to the size of container used.
